
# Society's Activities ~ February to June

We are delighted to be joining with the Archive Centre in our first joint venture in organising this weekend. Apart from the free exhibition of local memorabilia, the film show on Friday evening will focus on the history of shops and businesses in Crickhowell whilst on Saturday we will be celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the completion of the Brecon-Monmouthshire canal with a series of talks and walks. # **History Prize**

In a first for the Society, we sponsored a prize with Crickhowell Primary School for a project on 'Victorian Crickhowell'. Over 60 year 5 and 6 pupils submitted entries. We were delighted with the quality of the entries and with the enthusiasm shown by the pupils. We hope to sponsor a similar prize with Llangattock Primary School this year.

# Visit to the Regimental Museum, Brecon on Sunday 21 October

The Curator, Bill Cainan, who has spoken to our Society on several occasions, has very kindly arranged to open the Museum for a visit by the Society on 21 October. Bill will be on hand to show us around. The Museum is especially well known for its collection of memorabilia from the Boer War. Bill has also arranged for us to park on the barracks square but we will need to provide him with the car registrations of those who intend to go along. The entrance fee to the Museum is £4. # **Neolithic Tomb**

Many members will know that near to the entrance to Gwernvale Manor Hotel is the site of a former Neolithic tomb which is identified by a small group of standing stones. These stones have become overgrown with ivy and your Committee was approached by a local resident, not a Society member, to see if we could arrange to get the stones cleaned. Following some detective work by Janice we have been told that the stones stand on land owned by the Welsh Assembly and that Cadw is considering doing some work to tidy them up.



# Llangynidr Road

About 100 yards beyond Crickhowell Bridge on the Llangynidr Road between the oak tree and the road sign there is a stone set in the ground. The inscription is fading but seems to relate to the closing of a footpath. Can anyone give us some background, when was it put there, what is its purpose? Someone has suggested it denotes the closure of an informal footpath to the Glanusk Estate. Can you help please?
