'Lest We Forget': Clarence Hall Exhibition 9-11 November

Several hundred visitors attended this exhibition organised by Crickhowell & District Archive to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 1918 Armistice. For its centrepiece we were privileged to have on loan from the Went family a summary of the war record of Charlie Went, including the medal presented to him on his return from the war by the town.
